

Iowa Home Football Game Day Expectations How to Responsibly Tailgate in University Heights

- Do not let an arrest for public intoxication or drunk driving ruin your game day. Encourage guests to make a plan for a safe ride home before the game starts.
- Streets and sidewalks and the right-of-way must be kept clear. You and your guests should not congregate or set up chairs, tents, grills, games, or any other equipment on the street, sidewalk, or the area between the street and sidewalk.
- On the day of the game vehicles can park on lawns but must be removed by midnight.
- Make sure your guests are not trespassing on neighbors' property.
- All trash must be cleaned up and removed. Provide adequate trash containers on your property for your guests or require guests to haul their trash away. Trash must not be left at the curb.
- Keep music and all sound at a reasonable level. [Ordinance No. 159](#) is enforceable related to noise pollution, even on game day.
- Outdoor vending of merchandise is prohibited. ([Ordinance No. 81](#))
- Ask your guests to be considerate of neighbors and children, and curb inappropriate language and profanities.
- The use of fireworks is illegal in University Heights.
- Portable toilets:
 - Portable toilets that are visible from the street can only be put in place the Thursday before each Saturday game and must be removed by 5:00 p.m. the Sunday after the game (adjust days for non-Saturday games).
 - Portable toilets that are screened so they are not visible from the street may be put in place the Thursday before the first game and removed within 72 hours of the last game. The toilets must be cleaned by 5:00 p.m. the day after each game and must be kept locked on non-game days.
